during the POR by Kingtom, we are rescinding the 2019–2020 administrative review with respect to Kingtom.

# **Cash Deposit Requirements**

Kingtom did not receive a separate rate in a prior segment of this proceeding, and because we find that Kingtom had no shipments during the POR, we have not revised the cash deposit rate for Kingtom. As such, the China-wide entity rate of 86.01 percent continues to apply to Kingtom as a Chinese exporter. <sup>15</sup> Accordingly, Commerce will not issue revised cash deposit instructions to CBP.

### **Liquidation of Suspended Entries**

At this time, Commerce remains enjoined by CIT order from liquidating entries that: were produced and/or exported by Kingtom, and were entered, or withdrawn from warehouse, for consumption during the period May 1, 2019 through April 30, 2020. These entries will remain enjoined pursuant to the terms of the injunction during the pendency of any appeals process.

In the event the CIT's ruling is not appealed, or, if appealed, upheld by a final and conclusive court decision, Commerce intends to instruct CBP to assess antidumping duties on unliquidated entries of subject merchandise produced and/or exported by Kingtom in accordance with 19 CFR 351.212(b). We will instruct CBP to assess antidumping duties on all appropriate entries covered by this review when the importer-specific ad valorem assessment rate is not zero or de minimis. Where an import-specific ad valorem assessment rate is zero or de minimis,16 we will instruct CBP to liquidate the appropriate entries without regard to antidumping duties. Consistent with Commerce's assessment practice in non-market economy cases, where we have determined that an exporter under review had no shipments of subject merchandise, any suspended entries that entered under the exporter's case number (i.e., at that exporter's rate) will be liquidated at the China-wide rate.17

Through the joint amendment, the Council proposes establishing the same SFAA as originally proposed through Coral Amendment 10 to help the rock shrimp fishery achieve optimum yield while minimizing negative effects to the Coral HAPC.
