Notice is given that a complaint has been filed with the Federal Maritime Commission (the “Commission”) by American Iron & Metal Company Inc. (the “Complainant”) against Priva Logistics Inc. (the “Respondent”). Complainant states that the Commission has subject-matter jurisdiction over the complaint pursuant to the Shipping Act of 1984, as amended, 46 U.S.C. 40101, *et seq.*, and personal jurisdiction over

**ACTION:** Request for public comments.

*Description:* OHS is requesting an extension, without changes, of the Head Start PIR information collection authority. The following instruments are included in this information collection: (1) PIR, (2) Monthly Enrollment, and (3)

Center Locations and Contacts. The PIR is used for federal program management purposes including to promote decision-making using data, is a major source of information used to respond to Congressional and public inquiries about Head Start programs and is used often by researchers. Monthly enrollment reporting supports oversight activities related to promoting full enrollment of programs. Center locations and contact reporting is used to help parents locate a program in their community. In general, these information collections together create key administrative datasets to support administration of the program. There are no updates to the current OMB-approved PIR.

**Submission for Office of Management and Budget Review; Plan for Foster Care and Adoption Assistance—Title IV–E**  
**AGENCY:** Children’s Bureau, Administration for Children and Families, U.S. Department of Health and Human Services.  
**ACTION:** Request for public comments.  
**SUMMARY:** The Administration for Children and Families (ACF) is requesting a 3-year extension and revisions to the Plan for Foster Care and Adoption Assistance—Title IV–E, (OMB#: 0970–0433, expiration July 31,

2025). This plan also incorporates the plan requirements for the optional guardianship assistance, Title IV–E prevention services and the Title IV–E kinship navigator programs.  
**DATES:** *Comments due August 8, 2025.* In compliance with the requirements of the Paperwork Reduction Act of 1995, ACF is soliciting public comment on the specific aspects of the information collection described above.

**SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION:**  
*Description:* A title IV–E plan is required by section 471, part IV–E of the Social Security Act (the Act) for each public child welfare agency requesting federal funding under the Act for foster care and adoption assistance, as well as for the optional guardianship assistance, kinship navigator and prevention services programs. Section 479B of the Act provides for an Indian tribe, tribal organization or tribal consortium (tribe) to operate a title IV–E program in the same manner as a state with minimal exceptions. The tribe must have an approved title IV–E Plan.

The title IV–E plan provides assurances the programs will be administered in conformity with the specific requirements stipulated in title IV–E. The plan must include all applicable state or tribal statutory, regulatory, or policy references and citations for each requirement as well as supporting documentation. A title IV–E agency may use the pre-print format prepared by the Children’s Bureau or a different format, on the condition that the format used includes all the title IV–E plan requirements of the law.  
Section A of the title IV–E plan pre-print addresses requirements for the Foster Care, Adoption Assistance and optional Guardianship Assistance and Kinship Navigator programs. For these programs, the plan submission remains in effect until amendments are required due either to changes in federal requirements or agency operations.  
Section B of the title IV–E plan pre-print addresses requirements for the Prevention Services program. This program requires a plan submission every five years, and amendments as needed.  
Both sections of the title IV–E preprint include minor revisions to reflect recent changes in statutory, regulatory and policy requirements or options and to remove outdated
