draft EA that analyzes the environmental impacts on the human environment resulting from three alternatives: a no-action alternative, a dam removal alternative, and the applicant's proposed action.

Next Steps

The Service will evaluate the permit application and the comments received to determine whether the application meets the requirements of section 10(a) of the ESA. We will also conduct an intra-Service consultation pursuant to section 7 of the ESA to evaluate the effects of the proposed take. After considering the above findings, we will determine whether the permit issuance criteria of section 10(a)(l)(B) of the ESA have been met. If met, the Service will issue the requested ITP to the applicant.

Request for Public Comments

The Service invites comments and suggestions from all interested parties on the proposed HCP, draft EA, and supporting documents during a 30-day public comment period (see **DATES**). In particular, information and comments regarding the following topics are requested:

- 1. The effects that implementation of any alternative could have on the human environment;
- 2. Whether or not the significance of the impact on various aspects of the human environment has been adequately analyzed;
- 3. Any threats to the snuffbox mussel that may influence their populations over the life of the ITP that are not addressed in the proposed HCP or EA;
- 4. Whether the conservation measures outlined in the HCP are sufficient to offset impacts over a 30-year duration; and
- 5. Any other information pertinent to evaluating the effects of the proposed action on the human environment.

All comments received, including names and addresses, will become part of the administrative record associated with this action. Background

The ESA prohibits certain activities with endangered and threatened species unless authorized by a Federal permit. The ESA and our implementing regulations in part 17 of title 50 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) provide for the issuance of such permits and require that we invite public comment before issuing permits for activities involving endangered species.

A recovery permit issued by us under section 10(a)(1)(A) of the ESA authorizes the permittee to conduct activities with endangered species for scientific purposes that promote recovery or for enhancement of propagation or survival of the species. Our regulations implementing section 10(a)(1)(A) for these permits are found at 50 CFR 17.22 for endangered wildlife species, 50 CFR 17.32 for threatened wildlife species, 50 CFR 17.62 for endangered plant species, and 50 CFR 17.72 for threatened plant species.

Permit Applications Available for Review and Comment

The ESA requires that we invite public comment before issuing permits. Accordingly, we invite local, State,

Tribal, and Federal agencies and the public to submit written data, views, or arguments with respect to the applications in table 1. The comments and recommendations that will be most useful and likely to influence agency

decisions are those supported by quantitative information or studies. Proposed activities in the following permit requests are for the recovery and enhancement of propagation or survival of the species in the wild.
