**B. Need and Uses**

This clearance covers the information that offerors must submit to comply with the FAR requirements at FAR 52.237–10, Identification of Uncompensated Overtime. This provision requires offerors, when professional or technical services are acquired on the basis of the number of hours to be provided, to identify uncompensated overtime hours in excess of 40 hours per week, whether at the prime or subcontract level. This includes uncompensated overtime hours that are in indirect cost pools for personnel whose regular hours are normally charged direct.

The contracting officer will use the collected information to perform an adequate cost realism analysis of the offerors’ proposed labor rates. Proposals which include unrealistically low labor rates, or which do not otherwise demonstrate cost realism, will be considered by the contracting officer in a risk assessment and evaluated appropriately. The primary purpose for obtaining the information and using it during the source selection process is to discourage the use of uncompensated overtime.

**D. Public Comment**

A 60-day notice was published in the **Federal Register** at 90 FR 11974, on March 13, 2025. A comment was

received; however, it did not change the estimate of the burden.

*Comment:* This collection is in need of changes to improve efforts to avoid duplication of personnel service hours charged and possible overcharge of hours worked that are not part of the original agreement. This would be a significant cost savings measure for the Government.

*Response:* The respondents’ input is appreciated. Any changes to the collection will require rulemaking. The solicitation provision at FAR 52.237–10 requires offerors to identify uncompensated overtime hours in excess of 40 hours per week in their offers. The contracting officer will use the collected information to perform an adequate cost realism analysis of the offerors’ proposed labor rates.

EDE benefits state CSAs by reducing delays, costs, and barriers associated with interstate case processing. It increases state collections, improves document security, standardizes data sharing, increases state participation, and improves case processing, resulting in better overall child and spousal support outcomes. OCSE made minor updates to the Portal screens to enhance functionality.

**AGENCY:** Office of Refugee Resettlement; Administration for Children and Families; U.S. Department of Health and Human Services.

**SUMMARY:** The Office of Refugee Resettlement (ORR), Administration for

Children and Families (ACF), U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, requests approval from the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) and invites public comments on the proposed information collection, including proposed changes. The request consists of several forms that will allow the Unaccompanied Alien Children Bureau (UAC Bureau) to continue conducting statutorily mandated assessments of unaccompanied alien children (UAC—also referred to as “child” or “children”) in ORR care and custody as well as their sponsors. These assessments allow ORR to understand the status and needs of the child and their potential sponsor; assessment findings inform all decisions concerning the child’s care while in ORR custody and eventual reunification with a sponsor.
