Adopting Categorical Exclusions Under the National Environmental Policy Act; Notice Of Adoption Of Categorical Exclusions Under The National Environmental Policy Act

On July 3, 2025, the Commission issued an order in Docket No. CX25–2–000, pursuant to section 109 of the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), 42 U.S.C. 4336c, adopting two categorical exclusions from the US Bureau of Reclamation regarding actions at hydropower projects. *Adopting Categorical Exclusions Under the National Environmental Policy Act*, 192 FERC ¶ 61,019 (2025).

The adoption becomes effective 31 days after the issuance date of the Commission's order, *i.e.*, on August 4, 2025.

ACTION: Notice and request for comments.

SUMMARY: As part of its continuing effort to reduce paperwork burdens, and as required by the Paperwork Reduction Act (PRA) of 1995, the Federal Communications Commission (FCC or the Commission) invites the general public and other Federal agencies to take this opportunity to comment on the following information collection. Comments are requested concerning: whether the proposed collection of information is necessary for the proper performance of the functions of the Commission, including whether the information shall have practical utility; the accuracy of the Commission's burden estimate; ways to enhance the quality, utility, and clarity of the information collected; ways to minimize the burden of the collection of information on the respondents, including the use of automated collection techniques or other forms of information technology; and ways to further reduce the information collection burden on small business concerns with fewer than 25 employees.

Notice is given that a complaint has been filed with the Federal Maritime Commission (the “Commission”) by American Iron & Metal Company Inc. (the “Complainant”) against Priva Logistics Inc. (the “Respondent”). Complainant states that the Commission has subject-matter jurisdiction over the complaint pursuant to the Shipping Act of 1984, as amended, 46 U.S.C. 40101, *et seq.*, and personal jurisdiction over

Respondent as a non-vessel operating common carrier, as defined in 46 U.S.C. 40102(17), and ocean transportation intermediary, as defined in 46 U.S.C. 40102 (20).

Complainant is a corporation organized under the laws of Canada with its principal place of business located in Montreal, Canada.

Complainant identifies Respondent as a corporation organized under the laws of the State of New York with its principal place of business in Hicksville, New York.

Complainant alleges that Respondent violated 46 U.S.C. 41102(c); 41104(a)(10); 46 CFR 545.4; and 545.5. Complainant alleges these violations arose from Respondent’s refusal to release sea waybills until payment of charges associated with an unrelated booking, and other acts or omissions by Respondent.

An answer to the complaint must be filed with the Commission within 25 days after the date of service.
